Deze Onderwijs- en examenregeling is opgesteld overeenkomstig artikel 7.13 van de Wet op het hoger onderwijs en wetenschappelijk onderzoek (WHW) en is aangevuld met kwaliteitskenmerken zoals vastgelegd in het kaderdocument Leids universitair register opleidingen.

Overeenkomstig artikel 7.14 WHW beoordeelt het faculteitsbestuur de Onderwijs- en examenregeling regelmatig en weegt daarbij, ten behoeve van de bewaking en zo nodig bijstelling van de studielast, het tijdsbeslag dat daaruit voor de studenten voortvloeit. De opleidingscommissie heeft op grond van artikel 9.18 WHW tot taak de wijze van uitvoeren van de Onderwijs- en examenregeling jaarlijks te beoordelen.

Deze Onderwijs- en examenregeling bestaat uit twee delen; een algemeen deel dat voor alle opleidingen gelijk is, en een deel dat voor een opleiding specifieke informatie bevat. Dit opleidingsspecifieke gedeelte vormt één geheel met het algemeen deel en bevat alleen de artikelen die een opleidingsspecifieke invulling hebben.

Artikel 2.1 Doel van de opleiding

4. voorbereiding op een maatschappelijke loopbaan.

Artikel 2.3 Eindkwalificaties

Afgestudeerden van de opleiding hebben de onderstaande eindkwalificaties bereikt:

1. Knowledge and understanding

- a. Foundational knowledge of the history and development of Asian studies
- b. Knowledge of research in social sciences and humanities disciplines grounded in Asian studies
- c. Understanding of the concepts, terminology and approaches relevant to the regional and disciplinary specialization of the student, and their application in original research
- d. Understanding of aspects and/or countries in Asia in the context of Asia as a whole.

2. Applying knowledge and understanding

- a. Knowledge of the main humanities and social science research methods and techniques and their application in Asian studies
- b. Skills in locating, retrieving, assessing and using sources and specialist secondary literature for the purposes of original research
- c. Ability independently to design, conduct and complete original research on an aspect of Asian studies.

3. Judgement

- a. The ability to form a judgement on the basis of incomplete or limited information, whilst also taking into account the social and ethical responsibilities that come with the application of knowledge and assessments.

4. Communication

- a. Ability to interpret and comment on aspects and/or countries of East Asia for specialist and non-specialist audiences, and to act as cultural intermediary
- b. Ability to report, debate and discuss in a professional setting, both orally and in writing.

5. Learning skills

- a. The learning abilities required to be able to follow post-master's professional training or a PhD training of a largely self-determined or autonomous nature.

In addition, for the individual tracks certain specializations the following achievement levels apply:

Artikel 5.3 Toelatingseisen

The eligibility of students who do not have a BA that gives them the automatic right of entry will be determined by assessing their academic and professional qualifications. Requirements for admission include the following:

1. BA or equivalent in a relevant subject
2. Knowledge of the nature and role of and ability to analyse and report on academic inquiry in the humanities or social sciences
2. Foundational knowledge at BA level of the history, art, culture, politics, society, or economy of one or more East Asian countries or regions
3. For certain tracks or specializations: knowledge of a modern and/or classical Asian Chinese/Japanese/Korean language at a level sufficient for admission to the relevant language or language-based courses on the MA in Asian Studies 120 EC
4. For non-native speakers of English: proof of proficiency in English either IELTS score of 7.0 or TOEFL 99-100/250/600.
