# Course and Examination Regulations

Valid from 1 September 2013

## Programme-specific section

### Master's programme: Asian Studies (60 ec)

These course and examination regulations have been drawn up in accordance with Section 7.13 of the Higher Education and Research Act [*Wet op het hoger onderwijs en wetenschappelijk onderzoek*] (*WHW*) (henceforth the Act) and additional quality marks as set out in the framework document Leiden University Register of Study Programmes [*Leids universitair register opleidingen*].

Pursuant to Section 7.14 of the Act the faculty board regularly evaluates the course and examination regulations and assesses, for the purpose of monitoring and, if necessary, adjusting the study load, the time it takes students to comply with the regulations. In conformity with Section 9.18 of the Act the department teaching committee is assigned the task of annually assessing how the course and examination regulations are implemented.

These course and examination regulations consist of two sections: a general section that is the same for all programmes and a section that contains specific information for a particular programme. This programme-specific section forms a whole with the general section, and only contains those articles with content that is specific to a particular programme.

Appendix D – Curriculum

## **Article 2.1 Objectives of the Programme**

The programme has the following objectives:

1. to help students acquire academic knowledge, understanding and skills and use of academic methods in the field of Asian Studies;
2. to help students develop academic skills in:
  - independent academic reasoning and conduct,
  - analysing complex problems,
  - academic reporting;
3. to prepare students for an academic career and further education;
4. to prepare for a career outside academia.

## **Article 2.2 Specialisations**

The programme has the following specialisations:

- East Asian Studies
- History, Arts and Culture of Asia
- Politics, Society and Economy of Asia
- South Asian Studies
- Southeast Asian Studies

## **Article 2.3 Achievement Levels**

Graduates of the programme have attained the following achievement levels:

1. Knowledge and understanding
  - a. foundational knowledge of the history and development of Asian studies;
  - b. knowledge of research in social sciences and humanities disciplines that is grounded in Asian studies;
  - c. understanding of the concepts, terminology and approaches relevant to the regional and disciplinary specialisation of the student, and their application in original research;
  - d. understanding of aspects and/or countries in Asia in the context of Asia as a whole.
2. Applying knowledge and understanding
  - a. knowledge of the main humanities and social science research methods and techniques and their application in Asian studies;
  - b. skills in locating, retrieving, assessing and using sources and specialist secondary literature for the purposes of original research;
  - c. the ability to independently design, conduct and complete original research on an aspect of Asian studies.
3. Judgement
  - a. the ability to form a judgement on the basis of incomplete or limited information, whilst also taking into account the social and ethical responsibilities that come with the application of knowledge and assessments.
4. Communication

- a. the ability to interpret and comment on aspects and/or countries of East Asia for specialist and non-specialist audiences, and to act as cultural intermediary;
  - b. the ability to report, debate and discuss in a professional setting, both orally and in writing.
5. Learning skills
- a. the learning skills required to be able to follow post-master's professional training or a PhD training of largely self-determined or autonomous nature.

In addition, the following achievement levels apply to the individual tracks of certain specialisations:

*Specialisation: East Asia*

6. Knowledge and understanding

- a. Excellent command of modern Chinese, Japanese or Korean
- b. Broad knowledge of China, Japan or Korea, including their internal and external dynamics
- c. Knowledge of history, development and current trends in Chinese Studies, Japanese Studies or Korean Studies.

For certain concentrations:

- d. Excellent command of classical Chinese, classical Japanese or classical Korean.

7. Applying knowledge and understanding

- a. Ability to locate, assess and use original sources in modern or classical Chinese, modern or classical Japanese, or modern or classical Korean

*Specialisation: South Asia*

8. Knowledge and understanding

- a. Broad knowledge of South Asia, including its internal and external dynamics
- b. Knowledge of history, development and current trends in South Asian Studies.

For certain tracks:

- c. Beginners, intermediary, or excellent command of Hindi, Sanskrit, Classical Tibetan, or Pali.

9. Applying knowledge and understanding

For certain concentrations:

- a. Ability to locate, assess and use original sources in Hindi, Sanskrit, Classical Tibetan or Pali

*Specialisation: Southeast Asia*

10. Knowledge and understanding

- a. Broad knowledge of Southeast Asia, including its internal and external dynamics
- b. Knowledge of history, development and current trends in Southeast Asian Studies.

For certain concentrations:

- c. or excellent command of Malay/Indonesian.

11. Applying knowledge and understanding

For certain concentrations

- a. Ability to locate, assess and use original sources in Malay/Indonesian.

*Specialisation: History, Art and Culture*

13. Knowledge and understanding

- a. Broad knowledge of one or more regions in Asia, including their internal and external dynamics
- b. Knowledge of history, development and current trends in the study of the history, art or culture of these regions in Asia.

For certain concentrations:

- c. Beginners or intermediary command of an Asian language.

*Specialisation: Politics, Society and Economy*

14. Knowledge and understanding

- a. Broad knowledge of one or more regions in Asia, including their internal and external dynamics
- b. Knowledge of history, development and current trends in the study of the politics, society or economy of these regions in Asia.

For certain concentrations:

- c. Beginners or intermediary command of an Asian language.

## **Article 2.5 Study Load**

The programme has a study load of 60 credits.

## **Article 2.8 Language of instruction**

In compliance with the Code of Conduct regarding Foreign Languages [Gedragcode voertaal] the language of instruction and examination of the programme is English<sup>1</sup> Students are expected to have an adequate command of the language(s) of instruction of the programme.

## **Article 3.1 Compulsory Components**

3.1.1 The programme includes compulsory components totalling a study load of 60 credits. These compulsory components include the optional courses [*keuzevakken*] from which a student is obliged to choose. The compulsory components are listed in Appendix D. The study load (in credits) and the level is listed per course. Asian language acquisition courses should not exceed 15 EC. Students who wish to take more (for instance to start with learning a second Asian language) will have to apply for permission by the Examinations Committee.

## Article 5.3 Entry Requirements

Without prejudice to the provision in paragraph 5.2.1 regarding the capacity, those applicants will be admitted to the programme who:

- have earned the degree of Bachelor at a university not being a university of professional education, or demonstrate to meet the requirements for such a degree, including the General Academic Skills listed in Appendix C;
- are sufficiently proficient in the language of instruction, to be assessed by the faculty board (English TOEFL 600/250/100 or IELTS 7.0);
- possess comparable qualities in the field of knowledge, understanding and skills with those acquired upon graduating from the bachelor's programme referred to in article 5.1.
  - have knowledge of the nature and role of as well as the ability to analyse and report on academic inquiry in the humanities or social sciences;
  - have foundational knowledge at BA level of the history, art, culture, politics, society or economy of one or more East Asian countries or regions;

in addition to the admission requirements above, the following requirements per specialisation apply:

*Specialisation East Asian Studies :*

knowledge of a modern and/or classical Asian Chinese/Japanese/Korean language at a level sufficient for admission to the relevant language or language-based courses on the 120 EC MA in Asian Studies
