Course and Examination Regulations

Programme-specific section:

Master's Programme: Literary Studies

These course and examination regulations have been drawn up in accordance with Section 7.13 of the Higher Education and Research Act [*Wet op het hoger onderwijs en wetenschappelijk onderzoek*] (WHW) (henceforth the Act) and additional quality marks as set out in the framework document Leiden University Register of Study Programmes [*Leids universitair register opleidingen*].

Pursuant to Section 7.14 of the Act the Faculty Board regularly evaluates the course and examination regulations and assesses, for the purpose of monitoring and, if necessary, adjusting the study load, the time it takes students to comply with the regulations. In conformity with Section 9.18 of the Act, the department teaching committee is assigned the task of annually assessing how the course and examination regulations are implemented.

These course and examination regulations consist of two sections: a general section that is the same for all programmes and a section that contains information that is specific to a particular programme. This programme-specific section forms a whole with the general section, and only contains the articles with content that is specific to a particular programme.

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Article 2.1 **Objectives of the Programme**

The programme has the following objectives:

1. to enable students to acquire academic knowledge, understanding and skills, and train them in the use of scientific methods in the field of English, French, German and/or Italian Literary and Cultural Studies;
2. to enable students to develop the following academic and professional skills:
 - independent academic reasoning and conduct,
 - the ability to analyse complex problems,
 - academic reporting;
3. to prepare students for an academic career and further education;
4. to prepare students for a career outside academia.

Article 2.2 **Specialisations**

The programme has the following specialisations:

- English Literature and Culture
- French Literature and Culture
- German Literature and Culture
- Italian Literature and Culture

Article 2.3 **Achievement Levels**

Graduates of the programmes will have reached the following achievement levels:

1. *Knowledge and understanding*

Graduates:

- a. will be able to demonstrate knowledge of research methods that are used in the field of English/French/German/Italian Literary Studies;
- b. will be able to demonstrate advanced knowledge of at least one of the fields of English/French/German/Italian Literary Studies;
- c. will be able to demonstrate knowledge of the fields of English/French/German/Italian Literary Studies, the connections between these subfields, and the relations with other fields of study.

2. *Applying knowledge and understanding*

Graduates:

- a. will have the ability to critically apply theoretical, analytical and descriptive research methods to literature in English/French/German/Italian;
- b. will be able to apply their knowledge and insight in formulating a complex research problem in the field of English/French/German/Italian Literary Studies, and in reporting on the research done and its results.

3. *Making judgements*

Graduates:

- d. will have the ability to critically evaluate scholarly arguments and methods within the chosen sub-discipline of English/French/German/Italian Literary Studies, and to formulate an independent critical opinion of these arguments;

- e. will be able to provide a critical synthesis of scholarly arguments dealing with a given issue in the chosen sub-discipline of English/French/German/Italian Literary Studies, outlining the difference between the scientific results acquired and the problems that remain to be solved.

4. *Communication*

Graduates:

- f. will be able to give an oral presentation in English/French/German/Italian (CEFR levels specified in the table below), reporting on the work outlined in (2a) and (3a-b);
- g. will be able to write an Master's thesis in English/French/German/Italian (CEFR levels specified in the table below), on the work outlined in (2b) and (3a-b):

- h. will have the learning skills required to be able to follow post-master's professional training or a PhD training of a largely self-determined or autonomous nature.

Article 2.5 **Study Load**

The programme has a study load of 60 credits.

Article 2.8 **Language of Instruction**

In compliance with the Code of Conduct regarding Language of Instruction [*Gedragscode voertaal*¹] the languages of instruction and examination of the programme are English and, depending on the specialisation, French, German or Italian. Students are expected to have an adequate command of the languages of instruction of the programme.

Article 3.1 **Compulsory Components**

3.1.1 The programme includes compulsory components totalling a study load of 60 credits. These compulsory components include the optional courses [*keuzevakken*] from which a student is obliged to choose. Students may do one course from the national Masterlanguage curriculum as one of the compulsory components. Permission to register for such a course must first be given by the Board of Examiners.

5.2.1 Without prejudice to the stipulations of Article 5.1.1 regarding maximum capacity, persons who are in possession of (one of) the following degree(s) are granted direct admission to a specialisation of the programme:

5.2.2 Without prejudice to the stipulations in Article 5.1.1 regarding maximum capacity, persons who do not meet the entry requirements set in 5.2.1 will be granted admission to the programme, if they:

- have earned the degree of Bachelor at a university, not being a university of professional education, equivalent to the level of a Dutch academic Bachelor's degree, or demonstrate to meet the requirements for such a degree, including the General Academic Skills listed in Appendix C; and
- are sufficiently proficient in the language(s) of instruction, at the level specified in Article 5.2.3, to be assessed by the Faculty Board.

5.3.3 In addition to the requirements set out in 5.2.2, the following additional entry requirements apply to the following specialisations:

- Specialisation English Literature and Culture:
 - Sufficient command of English (IELTS 7.0, TOEFL 100 (internet-based) or Cambridge English: Proficiency (CPE)); a minimum score of IELTS 7.0 or TOEFL 25 is required for each of the four components); and
 - Knowledge of and insight in English Literature and Culture, comparable with the qualities acquired on completing the Bachelor's programme referred to in article 5.2.1, including:
 - knowledge of and insight in the connections with North American literature and culture;
 - knowledge of and insight in its development over the different periods (Middle Ages, Early Modern, and Modern);
 - analytical skills needed for specifically literary analysis;
 - a well-developed awareness of the relevant scholarly skills.
- Specialisation French Literature and Culture:
 - Sufficient command of English (IELTS 7.0, TOEFL 100 (internet-based) or Cambridge English: Proficiency (CPE)); and
 - Sufficient command of French (the minimum entry level is CEFR C1, as evidenced by an appropriate test (Dalf C1 with a C1 score for each of the subtests)); and
 - Knowledge of and insight in French Literature and Culture, comparable with the qualities acquired on completing the Bachelor's programme referred to in article 5.2.1, including:
 - knowledge of and insight in the connections with French speaking regions elsewhere in the world (so-called Francophonie);
 - knowledge of and insight in its development over the different periods (Middle Ages, Early Modern, and Modern);
 - analytical skills needed for specifically literary analysis;
 - a well-developed awareness of the relevant scholarly skills.
- Specialisation German Literature and Culture:

 - Sufficient command of Italian (the minimum entry levels are CEFR C1 (listening, reading) and CEFR B2 (speaking, writing), as evidenced by an appropriate test); and
 - Knowledge of and insight in Italian Literature and Culture, comparable with the qualities acquired on completing the Bachelor's programme referred to in article 5.2.1, including:
 - knowledge of and insight in its position in the European literary-historical context;
 - knowledge of and insight in its development over the different periods (Middle Ages, Early Modern, and Modern);
 - analytical skills needed for specifically literary analysis;
 - and a well-developed awareness of the relevant scholarly skills.

5.3.2 Without prejudice to the stipulations in Article 5.1.1 regarding maximum capacity, persons who do not meet the entry requirements set in 5.3.1 will be granted admission to the programme, if they:

- have earned the degree of Bachelor at a university, equivalent to the level of a Dutch academic Bachelor's degree, or demonstrate to meet the requirements for such a degree, including the General Academic Skills listed in Appendix C; and
- are sufficiently proficient in the language(s) of instruction, at the level specified in Article 5.3.3, to be assessed by the Faculty Board.

5.3.3 In addition to the requirements set out in 5.3.2, the following additional entry requirements apply to the following specialisations:

- Specialisation English Literature and Culture:
 - Sufficient command of English (IELTS 7.5, TOEFL 113 (internet-based) or Cambridge English: Proficiency (CPE)); a minimum score of IELTS 7.0 or TOEFL 25 is required for each of the four components); and
 - Knowledge of and insight in English Literature and Culture, comparable with the qualities acquired on completing the Bachelor's programme referred to in article 5.3.1, including:
 - knowledge of and insight in the connections with North American literature and culture;
 - knowledge of and insight in its development over the different periods (Middle Ages, Early Modern, and Modern);
 - analytical skills needed for specifically literary analysis;
 - a well-developed awareness of the relevant scholarly skills.

The requirement to provide an English language test result applies to all students who have completed a Bachelor's programme other than the Bachelor's programme referred to in article 5.3.1. This is at the discretion of the Admissions Board.

 - Sufficient command of English (IELTS 7.0, TOEFL 100 (internet-based) or Cambridge English: Proficiency (CPE)); and
 - Sufficient command of French (the minimum entry level is CEFR C1, as evidenced by an appropriate test (Dalf C1 with a C1 score for each of the subtests)); and
 - Knowledge of and insight in French Literature and Culture, comparable with the qualities acquired on completing the Bachelor's programme referred to in article 5.3.1, including:
 - knowledge of and insight in the connections with French speaking regions elsewhere in the world (so-called Francophonie);
 - knowledge of and insight in its development over the different periods (Middle Ages, Early Modern, and Modern);
 - analytical skills needed for specifically literary analysis;
 - a well-developed awareness of the relevant scholarly skills.
- Specialisation German Literature and Culture:
 - Sufficient command of English (IELTS 7.0, TOEFL 100 (internet-based) or Cambridge English: Proficiency (CPE)); and
 - Sufficient command of German (the minimum entry level is CEFR C1, as evidenced by an appropriate test (Goethe-Zertifikat C1)); and
 - Knowledge of and insight in German Literature and Culture, comparable with the qualities acquired on completing the Bachelor's programme referred to in article 5.3.1, including:

- knowledge of and insight in its development over the different periods (Middle Ages, Early Modern, and Modern);
 - knowledge of and insight in cultural differences between the Netherlands and German speaking regions and elementary Dutch-German intercultural skills;
 - analytical skills needed for specifically literary analysis;
 - a well-developed awareness of the relevant scholarly skills.
- Specialisation Italian Literature and Culture:
 - Sufficient command of English (IELTS 7.0, TOEFL 100 (internet-based) or Cambridge English: Proficiency (CPE)); and
 - Sufficient command of Italian (the minimum entry levels are CEFR C1 (listening, reading) and CEFR B2 (speaking, writing), as evidenced by an appropriate test); and
 - Knowledge of and insight in Italian Literature and Culture, comparable with the qualities acquired on completing the Bachelor's programme referred to in article 5.3.1, including:
 - knowledge of and insight in its position in the European literary-historical context;
 - knowledge of and insight in its development over the different periods (Middle Ages, Early Modern, and Modern);
 - analytical skills needed for specifically literary analysis;
 - and a well-developed awareness of the relevant scholarly skills.
 - Specialisation Literature in society. Europe and Beyond.
 - Sufficient command of English (IELTS 7.0, TOEFL 100 (internet-based) or Cambridge English: Proficiency (CPE)); for the 'speaking' and 'writing' components, a minimum score of IELTS 7.0 of TOEFL 25 is required; and
 - Knowledge of and insight in Literature and Culture, comparable with the qualities acquired on completing one of the Bachelor's programmes referred to in article 5.3.1, including:
 - basic knowledge and understanding of the history of literature and of major literary works.
 - knowledge of basic tools of literary analysis and proven ability to apply them.
 - analytical skills needed for specifically literary analysis
 - a well-developed awareness of the relevant scholarly skills.

Students who have completed an academic Bachelor's programme in Humanities other than the Bachelor's programmes referred to in article 5.3.1. may be required to complete an individual bridging programme (5 tot max. 30 credits) .

Article 5.5 **Bridging Programmes (Premasters)**

5.5.1 The programme has established the following bridging programmes (for the following target groups) in order to remedy deficiencies:

The bridging programmes are intended for students with a relevant academic Bachelor's degree from a university, who do not fulfill the admission requirements specified in article 5.3, and for students with a Bachelor's degree from a university of professional education [*HBO*] in English, French or German (lower secondary education certificate, *tweedegraads*). Next to the bridging programmes below, the Admissions Board may specify individual bridging programmes for other students who do not fully meet the entry requirements. Students will not be admitted to the Master's programme if they have not completed the relevant bridging programme in its entirety.

Specialisation English Literature and Culture

The pre-master's programme has a study load of 50 EC and consists of first-year courses (35 credits), second-year courses (0/5 credits) and third-year courses (15/10 credits).
